I know – you don't get a Newsletter for ages then two come along at once. The prime purpose of this one is to give you details of Study Day 2014.

First - The Basics

Study Day 2014. Jazz on a Summer's Day.

With Scott Stroman and the Guildhall School of Music Jazz Orchestra.

Date - Wednesday 16th July 2014

Place - Cecil Sharp House, 2 Regent's Park Road, London NW1.

Cost £20

Details:

We have been fortunate in getting Scott Stroman, Professor of Jazz at the Guildhall School of Music, to present the Day, with his splendid young musicians in the Guildhall Jazz Orchestra. This will be the fourth consecutive year Scott has agreed to do this for us.

<u>Venue.</u> You will know that I had to turn many of you away last year, as the theatre was full. As the Bridewell Theatre cannot take us this year, I have had the opportunity to seek out a bigger venue. (Thanks, by the way, for all of your suggestions). I have secured the Kennedy Hall at Cecil Sharp House. Many of you will know that Cecil Sharp House is the HQ of the English Folk Dance and Song Society (EFDSS). It is a big hall (an easy 300 seats); the building has a cafeteria that serves snacks, teas, coffees, Real Ales, sandwiches and some hot meals. Disabled access is easy and we may be able to find on-site parking for a few cars for disabled

visitors and even a minibus or two. The nearest Tube is Camden Town (it's a 10 minute amble away).

I am particularly keen on this venue as it has everything we need. There are the usual pubs, restaurants & coffee bars a few minutes away but there is no real need to leave at all. For those who fancy an al fresco picnic (and the day is fine), the House has a garden

<u>Timetable.</u> Start at 11 am. Finish by 4 pm. 1 hour lunch break – 1 pm to 2 pm. Tea and coffee available before we start and during lunch.

<u>Cost</u>. Provided we are well supported, I can keep it at an inflation busting £20. As it is a bigger hall, it'll cost us more to hire but as long as all of you jazz lovers keep up high levels of support, we'll cover our costs.

<u>Theme.</u> I've called it Jazz on a Summer's Day, as that's what it'll be, but beyond that, I'm happy to leave it to Scott. You will recall from previous study days that Scott takes us off in interesting directions, regardless of the title of the day!
